## PATIENT BILL OF RIGHTS

As a child or youth receiving behavioral health services from the NWESD 189 you have the following rights and responsibilities in accordance with Washington Administrative Code (WAC) 388-877-0600.

- 1) Receive services without regard to race, creed, national origin, religion, gender, sexual orientation, age or disability;
- 2) Practice the religion of choice as long as the practice does not infringe on the rights and treatment of others or the treatment service. Individual participants have the right to refuse participation in any religious practice;
- 3) Be reasonably accommodated in case of sensory or physical disability, limited ability to communicate, limited English proficiency, and cultural differences;
- 4) Be treated with respect, dignity and privacy, except that staff may conduct reasonable searches to detect and prevent possession or use of contraband on the premises;
- 5) Be free of any sexual harassment;
- 6) Be free of exploitation, including physical and financial exploitation;
- 7) Have all clinical and personal information treated in accord with state and federal confidentiality regulations;
- 8) Review your clinical record in the presence of the administrator (Prevention Center Director) or designee (Behavioral Health Program Manager) and be given an opportunity to request amendments or corrections;
- 9) Receive a copy of agency (NWESD 189) complaint and grievance procedures (Policy 3210, Nondiscrimination/Procedure 3210P, Nondiscrimination Procedures and/or Policy 4220, Complaints Concerning Staff or Programs/Procedure 4220P, Complaints Concerning Staff or Programs Procedures) upon request and to lodge a complaint or grievance with the agency (NWESD 189), or Regional Support Network (RSN) (North Sound Mental Health Administration), if applicable, if you believe your rights have been violated; and
- 10) File a complaint with the department (Department of Social and Health Services) when you feel the agency (NWESD 189) has violated a WAC requirement regulating behavior health agencies.
