


Vocabulary Study Card: Sample

front of card:

Illiterate, adj.
(i-lit'er-it)

new word (points to 'Illiterate')

part of speech (points to 'adj.')

pronunciation (points to '(i-lit'er-it)')

related word forms (points to list):

- literate (adjective)
- literacy (noun)
- illiteracy (noun)

analfabeto (points to 'analfabeto')


first language translation (points to 'analfabeto')

back of card:

1. *synonym*: non-reader; *antonym*: literate ——— *reminder words (synonyms, antonyms)*
2. "Many illiterate adult immigrants come from cultures where education was not available or was denied." ——— *original context/source*
3. not literate; unable to read and write ——— *dictionary definition*
4. About half the population is still illiterate despite free public schooling. ——— *dictionary example*
5. My grandmother is an illiterate adult because she worked on her family's farm as a child and was unable to go to school. ——— *student's own sentence*
