### BUILDING LEVEL SCREENING PROTOCOL

- Step 1: Make Sure All Students/Staff Are Safe
  
- Step 2: Notify the Student's Parent(s) or Guardian(s)
  
- Step 3: Assessment – Discuss, Investigate and Document
  
- Step 4: Develop a Student Supervision and Intervention Plan
  
- Step 5: Consider Need for a County Level Assessment
  
- Step 6: Completing Building Level Packet
