
Inside the Exploratorium, you can:

Consider these small, practical shifts- simple to implement, but powerful in creating classrooms where all learners can thrive.

- <u>Label Everything Clearly</u>: Consistent labels on materials, bins, and tech
  help everyone navigate the classroom.
- Provide <u>Visual Schedules</u>: Pair images with text to reduce anxiety and build independence.
- Offer <u>Flexible Seating</u>: Let students choose seating that supports focus and comfort and <u>increases engagement</u>.
- <u>Share Materials</u> in Advance: Post slides, notes, or key vocabulary before class for easy preview and preparation.
- Build in <u>Wait Time</u>: Pause after questions so all learners have time to think and respond.
