The Open Educational Resources (OER) Project at OSPI is exploring interest in holding an OER Bootcamp. This **FREE event, with travel costs covered**, would be an opportunity for district teams to bring their developed resources for a 2-day work session focused on the following goals:

- **Review** district materials that have been adapted or developed for adherence to resource licenses or copyright permission
- **Replace** any "all rights reserved" copyrighted images, charts, articles, etc. with openly licensed options
- **Ensure** proper attribution has been provided and clearly indicate any areas that will not fall under open license
- **Apply** an open license to district created materials
- **Identify** options for housing developed materials so they are accessible to the public
- **Create** a group on Washington OER Commons Hub and link to district adapted/developed resources
