This is the ninth year bringing together a group of bright and motivated literacy learners (formerly the Literacy Leadership Network) to focus on successful implementation of the Washington State Learning Standards for ELA (CCSS) and instructional best practices in literacy to positively impact our region's students.

Our NWESD regional focus is deeper learning, and this year's sessions will be organized around the six [Deeper Learning Competencies](#) (Creativity, Critical Thinking, Communication, Collaboration, Citizenship, and Character/Growth Mindset). Additionally, the participants will focus on creating lessons and units of study that require students to apply the reading, writing, and speaking and listening standards at a deeper level. While each session will have an overarching theme, participants will have the opportunity to self-select topics of interest within the theme as their personal area of focus. Time will be provided for collaborative discussions and planning with colleagues who share a similar interest. Participants will bring student work to each session to analyze and reflect upon instructional implications.
