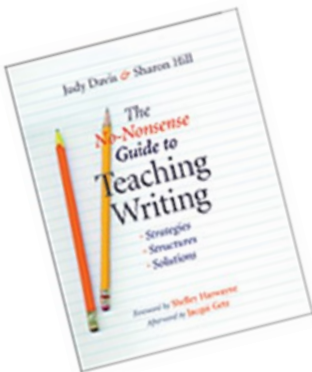


# Writer's Workshop in the Elementary Classroom

Implementing an effective writer's workshop model creates a community of writers who view themselves as capable, confident authors while also supporting them in developing the skills necessary to meet rigorous writing standards. This 3-session series is designed to support teachers in establishing a writer's workshop model in their classroom that will lead to increased student writing and engagement.
