What is Autism?

Did you know...

Autism affects an estimate of 1 in 88 children and is the fastest growing developmental disability in the United States. (Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, 2012)

Autism spectrum disorder (ASD) refers to a neuro-developmental disability characterized by impairments in reciprocal social interactions, verbal and non-verbal communication skills, and stereotyped behavior, interests, and activities.

Autism diagnostic criteria is divided into two areas: social communication impairment and restricted and repetitive patterns of behavior.

Autism is a spectrum disorder, meaning that there is a wide variation in the severity of symptoms, ranging from mild to severe. No two children are alike!
