Students may choose to take credits at the 400 or 500 level. Students planning to enroll in the M.Ed. Program at Western should plan to take 500-level coursework. To earn a TESOL Certification, 6 additional credits will need to be completed.

Students interested in completing the bilingual endorsement must take one additional course, ELL 438 (5 credits), and successfully pass the ACTFL World Language Proficiency Exam at the Advanced-Mid level.

Bachelor's degree

Valid state teaching certification

Prior study of a world language, demonstrated by:

- Completing three years of a world language in high school
- Completing one complete year of a world language at a college or university
- Developing an alternative plan, as approved by the program director

Be employed as a teacher in a K-12 classroom during the program

- 2. Provide proof of valid state teaching certification and employment.
- 3. Submit the WWU Extended Education Transfer & Post-baccalaureate Admissions Application and \$55 fee by visiting <u>admissions.wwu.edu/extended-education</u>
- 4. Request an official transcript from the institution where you earned your bachelor's degree, as well as any transcripts to prove completion of world-language study, as detailed under Eligibility. If you previously attended WWU, it is not necessary to provide WWU transcripts previously submitted to WWU. Have official transcripts sent electronically or in a sealed envelope to:
