Goal Setting:

Learning Targets:

Learn how to use the EVAL tool to create goals.

Uploading Artifacts and Entering Evidence: (This can be done as part of Goal Setting or as a separate module depending on time.)

Prior to Training:

An understanding of a shared definition of what artifact and evidence means.

An artifact is something you create or gather.

The outcome of the artifact is the evidence.

Learning Targets:

- The artifacts are evidence of teaching skills not necessarily visible in observations.
- Learn how to add artifacts in the EVAL system. (This can be used in several parts of the EVAL)

- Take teachers through the steps as listed in the latest version of the Evidence section of eVAL Washington for Evaluatees
- 3 pieces of evidence for each criterion areas is required. This could be from artifacts and or the observations,
- Videos are powerful pieces of evidence. (You will need to set up capacity to store teacher videos.)

Cathey's example:

Prompt: How will my students begin to master the Common Core Standards in English this year?

Goal: By June, 2014, 80% of the students in 8th Grade English will demonstrate mastery of the selected Common Core Standards each quarter as measured by student performance on a department-created mastery assessment.

To achieve this goal, by June, 2014, I will have worked with my department to align one unit per quarter with the Common Core Standards as measured by lesson plans and assessments with hyperlinks to the standards that we share on our school website.
